2.1.3 Curriculum Enrichment:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Curriculum revision as per University norms and guidelines. College has a Life Skills Cell through which workshops are conducted. Introduction of interdisciplinary courses may be encouraged.
2.1.4 Feedback System:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Some faculty members participated in Syllabus Revision Workshop arranged by colleges. Informal feedback from alumni.

2.2 TEACHING LEARNING AND EVALUATION:	
2.2.1 Student Enrolment and Profile:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Spot admissions are given to the candidates having 60 percent or more by following reservation norms of the Government. Adequately inclusive admissions representing different sections. Student catchment area is confined mainly to the Nagpur and neighbouring areas. Online admission procedure is yet to be adopted.
2.2.2 Catering to Student Diversity:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For slow learners, remedial classes are conducted. Institution follows Mentoring System. Facilities provided for differently abled students.
2.2.3 Teaching - Learning Process:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Academic calendar and teaching plan are prepared at the beginning of the year. Language laboratory in place. Classroom tests are often conducted for practice. Interactive teaching techniques need to be introduced.

D. and one teacher has M.Phil. • Five faculty members are recognised Ph. D. Guides. • A couple of teachers received three awards. • "Evaluation of teachers by students" is in place.
2.2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are informed about the evaluation process. • College is implementing all reforms introduced by the University. • University has adopted semester pattern for UG and PG programmes.
2.2.6 Student Performance and Learning Outcomes:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are informed about their progress in their academic performance. • In couple of programmes, the results of the college are better than the university results, while in some programmes, both results are equal or university results are better than the college results. • Learning outcomes may be strengthened.

2.3.1 Promotion of Research:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • College has University recognised research centres in Political Science, Commerce and English • Seven seminars / workshops organised by departments.
2.3.2 Resource Mobilisation and Research:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Total 10 faculty members received around Rs. 7.17 lakhs from UGC for minor research projects. • More research grant may be secured from outside agencies. • College management may provide seed money for young researchers.
2.3.3 Research Facilities:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • College is granted three research centres in 2016. Ph. D. Students are yet to be enrolled. • Library, laboratories and computer facilities available for research.

Tree plantations, Blood Donation Camps, Swachh Abhiyan etc. are conducted regularly. College maintains regular relations with old age home and orphanage.

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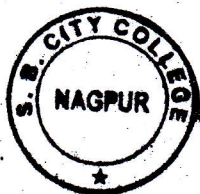
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SECTION IV: RECOMMENDATIONS FOR QUALITY ENHANCEMENT OF THE INSTITUTION
